

House of Play + Education

Families in the Stockfield area can access a wide range of free activities and support locally at the House of Play + Education on Warwick Road (Just opposite the Nissan garage).

The House of Play + Education is run by local people for local people, it provides a warm and homely environment for local families offering stay and play groups, counselling, healthy eating workshops and support to access employment and childcare.

The centre has recently celebrated its 5th birthday and has undertaken a £10,000 overhaul to improve the facilities.

Senior Children and Families Worker, Gemma Sharman, commented "this is a home from home environment – families are welcome to just pop in when they need us, there's no waiting lists and you will always be welcome".

In addition to play and education there is:

- Support for parents from a dedicated Employment and Skills Worker to consider accessing employment or training
- One-one counselling via a professional counsellor or art therapist (Simone)

The Acocks Green Village in Bloom team has secured the Gold Award in each of the past three years in the Urban category of Britain in Bloom. What is more, Acocks Green was the only urban area from Birmingham to enter the campaign in 2017.



To add to this, we have gained the 'Community' Achievement' award, which comes with a beautiful glass trophy that is currently featuring in a window display in Jeffries Hardware.

These are the comments from the judges:

'The community-led Bloom initiative in Acocks Green village goes from strength to strength

This year the judges saw and heard about more horticultural projects, schools' engagement, the new Heritage Trail, new village sculpture, bigger and better events (including the launch event for 2017) and a new 2017 calendar.

Newcomers and first-time entries are highly recommended to spend a day with Fran Lee and the team to gain first-hand knowledge of how to bring together community resources. Well done everyone.'

Some of this success can be attributed to the interchange the team has had with Stockfield.

We have thoroughly enjoyed being part of the fabulous 'Fun Day', where we have introduced children to the joys of sowing seeds, taking the pots home and nurturing the plants. In some instances, children have returned the following year and told us of their successes.

We also enjoy planting the hanging baskets for the raffle and asking the shopkeepers in Acocks Green to donate seeds for different projects.

Fran has been very pleased to be asked to judge the Garden Competition.

This year the Bloom team has worked particularly hard, especially at the entrance from Solihull into Birmingham. What was once a neglected 'no-man's land' has, with the help and co-operation of the local council, been transformed into a beautiful, wild flower-adorned area.

Other comments from the judges include a mention that the vibrant barrier planters, complemented by the community cottage garden-style planting, 'make Acocks Green unique'.

That's what we set out to do — to make Acocks Green UNIQUE — and the judges certainly agreed with us!
