- held 3 'Heritage of Play' sessions at Carrs Lane Gardens



BLOW THE WHISTLE ON HOUSING CHEATS

IF YOU SUSPECT SOMEONE OF HOUSING FRAUD CONTACT YOUR LANDLORD

Most people applying for housing wait their turn to be allocated a home. Housing cheats don't wait, they jump the queue. It's not fair.

They use up valuable housing spaces which deprive those in greater need. They are guilty of housing fraud.

What is housing fraud?

There are different types of housing fraud; here are some of the most common:

Unlawful subletting

When a tenant lets out their council or housing association home without the knowledge or permission of their landlord they are unlawfully subletting.

They often continue to pay the rent for the property directly to their landlord, but charge the person they are subletting to a much higher rate. It is not fair to sublet and to profit from a property which could be given to someone in greater need.

> Obtaining housing by deception

When a person gets a council or housing association home by giving false information in their application, for example not telling the landlord they are renting another council or housing association property, they are committing housing fraud.

Wrongly claimed succession

When a tenant dies, there are rules that say what should be done with the tenancy. Wrongly claimed succession is when someone, who is not entitled, tries to take over the tenancy. For example, they might say they lived with the tenant before they died, when in fact they were living elsewhere.

What can you do to help?

We are working hard to track down housing cheats and ensure that homes are given to those who are the next in line.

Your help in reporting housing fraud is important because you can see what's going on in your neighbourhood.

- You might know that somebody has a home the landlord doesn't know about or has given false information in their housing application
- ➤ You might suspect someone of housing fraud having seen them collect rent from your neighbours
- You might be suspicious because the tenants of a property keep changing

If you suspect someone is a housing cheat, let us know. It could make a real difference.

Anything you tell us will be held in the strictest confidence. All reports can be made anonymously.

What's next?

We will investigate your concerns and the necessary action will be taken. If someone is found to have committed housing fraud that person could lose their tenancy.

It has been a great few months for the girls as participation in physical activities has increased by a whopping 250%.



This past quarter, some of the girls completed a nationally recognised Leadership Award in which they learned and demonstrated key leadership skills.

They also got involved in the Sport 4 Life / Stockfield Community initiative in collecting donations for the Acocks Green FoodBank and were rewarded with a trip to see Cinderella at the Birmingham Hippodrome and will be performing their routines at the MAC Theatre @ Cannon Hill Park in July.







Builders in Bloom!

In the previous edition, I wrote about our project to enhance the entrance into Birmingham from Solihull, where Olton Boulevard and the Warwick Road meet. We have now decided to take up the Britain in Bloom judges' suggestion of making an impact on the main triangular traffic island, which we now refer to as 'The Triabout.'



Well, what a challenge! One of our team designed and sketched out a bed echoing the shape of the island. It is not only large – approximately 8.5 metres wide at the widest point and 15 metres long – but also features a circular brick built raised bed. We aim to surround this with shrubs featuring blue, purple and yellow leaves and flowers that provide interest all year round.

This winter we started with the task of digging out the shape of the bed, using the cut turf to fill in the other bare patches. Then came the more mammoth task of digging out the trench for the footings of the brickwork. We now know what the soldiers of WWI went through!

We still had a lot of questions that needed answering in order to get the project underway: who would provide the bricks when we need over 1000 of them? Where would we store them? How would we get the concrete poured into the tube area (builders' jargon) in which to sink the footings? Who would build the wall? Which shrubs would make up the colour combination and thrive in possible drought and winds prevalent across an exposed site?

Our Village in Bloom team, not to be put off, contacted a local builders' merchant who said they would kindly donate the bricks for our community project. As I write another local contractor is looking at pouring the concrete for us. We put out a call for a bricklayer on the Neighbourhood Forum Facebook page and local resident Jerome came forward to volunteer his skills. He has provided a detailed design and is leading the construction. The local car wash is kindly allowing us to store the bricks and we have used our horticultural experience and knowledge to arrive at the right shrubs.

Once again our knack of pulling all the people and resources of Acocks Green together will provide another unique aspect to this wonderful part of Birmingham. So keep an eye out for the transformation of the 'Triabout!'

Fox Hollies - a beautiful park

Westley Vale Millennium Green has been a key green space on our judging route for the past six years, however the trustees have decided to take a break from being part of our entry for 2018. All is not lost as we are now including Fox Hollies Park to fulfil the Britain in Bloom criteria for biodiversity and wildlife habitats.

The park is beautifully landscaped and has Westley Brook running through it; a circular pool which is popular with fishermen; and a deep copse which provides a quiet woodland area for wildflowers and birds. Dog walkers have spotted egrets and kestrels in the park and it is alive with the flora associated with the English countryside. We are supported by the strong Friends of Fox Hollies Park group who have plans to sow wild flowers and put up bird boxes.

Who needs to go to the countryside when we have this on our doorstep?

Gardening Tips for Spring

You can start some seeds growing on a sunny windowsill in trays or pots until it warms up out side, after the risk of frosts, by the end
of May. Fruit punnets with drainage holes make great little seed trays.

Sow hardy annual flower seeds, herbs and wildflowers outdoors, follow instructions on the packet.

Sow grass seeds in bare patches of lawn

Sow vegetable seeds directly into the ground once you've dug it over. Radishes and beetroot are good ones to try if you are new to gardening but there are so many other vegetables that will flourish given the right situation; choose something you like to eat!

Tie in climbing and rambling roses to keep them growing in the right direction.

Plant the English Lavendula (lavender) Augustifolia 'Hidcote' which makes a lovely low hedge.

Divide late flowering perennials to increase your stock or swap with your neighbours!

Water camelias well after flowering and continue to do so throughout the Summer.

- Stake perennial plants before they grow too tall, hazel twigs are good for this, putting them into the ground, bending over and tying together which can look great
- Most importantly, if you haven't already done so, then give gardening a go! There will be failures along the way but try different plants and you will be rewarded with some lovely results.
