Some of the hanging baskets have been really eye catching.

I am looking forward to this, as a greater number of residents enter each year. There are of course prizes given to each entrant so please do give it a go. I so want to see more of the magic which is Stockfield.

Gardening in Summer - hints and tips

• In case of drought once again this year, install a water butt using one of your downpipes; this saves on tap water.

Deadhead plants to ensure continuous flowering

- Pick courgettes before they become marrows guess who did not do this it is a good thing one of my neighbours loved marrows.
- Create a pond; this is excellent for wildlife including frogs and birds.
- Cut back delphiniums and geraniums to encourage second flowering.

Divide clumps of bearded iris (I just love irises!)
