

I am looking forward to all the new projects we have coming up as well as meeting residents' business owners and shop keepers over the next few months. If you see me out do, please say hello.



Acocks Green Village in Bloom - Springtime Update

We know Spring is here with the daffodils, primroses and crocuses appearing following the early snowdrops – the light at the end of winter's tunnel.

Coupled with nature, our plans are starting to come to fruition for the coming Bloom year. We have secured a grant from the 'Celebrating Communities' funding made available as a result of the Commonwealth Games coming to Birmingham this year. Here are some of our plans for the year ahead:

Find the Flags Trail



There are 54 countries that belong to the Commonwealth. As a fun and interesting way to celebrate the different countries, Village in Bloom will be launching a 'Find the Flags Trail' around Acocks Green village.

Starting in June, you will be able to pick up a Trail Sheet from one of the participating businesses and go on a hunt around shops and businesses in the village to locate the 54 flags. When you find one of the flags, just write down where you saw it. Will you be able to you find all 54?!

Completed forms can be returned to collection points around the village and everyone who completes at least 50% of the flag trail will receive a commemorative souvenir. All entries will also go into a prize draw to have a chance of winning our Top Prize! As well as finding the flags participants will learn an interesting fact about each country.

The trail will be launched at the celebration Street Party on 4th June (see below). The form will also be available online to print out at home. The Flag Trail will be in place from the beginning of June until just before the start of the Commonwealth Games on 28th July. Everyone in the area is welcome to enter - children and adults too!

As well as the Flag Trail, some of the funds will go towards sourcing plants that are native to some of the Commonwealth countries to incorporate into planting in Acocks Green. We will of course have to choose plants appropriate for our climate. One example is Agapanthus from South Africa, known as African lily, which we will plant amongst the grey foliage of the Staccys Byzantina in the Triabout flowerbed (on the large island at the entry to the village from Olton). Another is Camellia Sinensis var. Assamica, which is a shrub from India. You might know it as the plant that produces tea! We hope to plant this in our herb bed at the Orchard in Mallard Close. With its white flowers it will look pretty as well as make you feel good!

Street Party



Our third plan is a celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. This will be held in the village on Saturday 4th June from 11am. The Village in Bloom team will be based around Mallard Close Community Orchard, selling plants, seed-sowing, giving gardening advice and will be joined by our local Beekeeper. There will be live music from popular rock band Canoe – playing tunes that span the reign of Elizabeth II. Kimichi Music school will be performing some classical tunes with our very own 'Britannia' performing Rule Britannia, and other Last Night of the Proms classics.

The service road in front the shops near Mallard Close will be closed to traffic for an array of interesting stalls. If you would like to have a stall, please get in touch. We are looking for crafts, vintage and plenty of plants and produce. Let's make the day go with a zing!

Dressing up for the occasion will be encouraged - we hope to see clothes from the fifties and sixties or other classic eras of our Queen's reign. What about seventies heels and flares? Perhaps someone would like to dress up as Churchill who was Prime Minister when the Queen first came to the throne! Have we got a Queen lookalike in the village?!

Last year we transformed a piece of waste ground on Yardley Road in front of the three billboards, close to the canal access. After lots of digging, wildflower seeds were sown to form a meadow which looked beautiful in the summer. We have dug over the site again this year to rid it of excess weeds and will be sowing more wildflower seeds in April. We've also planted lots of daffodil bulbs at this site and in the beds by The Great Western Pub, which will flower each year. It really makes people proud when they see the results, such an improvement on what was there before. You can feel this pride too - if you would like to help, do get in touch.

April Seed Sowing!

If you haven't already sown some seeds, then why not give it a go this year. Popular vegetables to start growing in April are cucumber, pepper, chilli, tomato, cabbage, beetroot, carrot, parsnip or how about herbs like basil? If you like flowers, easy seeds to try are marigolds, cosmos, sweet peas, sunflowers and nasturtium.



Bring a bit of colour to your neighbourhood. Follow the instructions on the back of the packets or go to Acocks Green or Yardley Library where they have an array of books full of gardening advice.


